More suggested rules changes for our beloved league.

1. For the 1993 season, no trading of draft picks before the 15 man roster is set. My feeling is that such a rule would help bring parity to each league by having everyone equal at the time rosters are set, 15 men and fifteen draft picks. Once roster are set you could trade picks or players as you wish.

Before rosters are selected you can trade players or a players rights for a player this year.

I honestly feel this rule would help the $\underline{\text{league}}$, and strengthen $\underline{\text{all}}$ clubs in the long run.

This rule would also help deepen the draft pool, if you can not trade your extra players they would all go back into the draft.

- 2. A sixteen man roster, with the 16th man confined to the minor leagues for the season. This would allow a team to protect a player who may have been injuried that year.
- 3. On draft day, after all selections have been made, if a team wished to take a player who had gone undrafted, it would cost a future 15th round pick.
- 4. If a pitcher hits two batters within three innings he is ejected from the game.
- Be allowed to change your ballpark numbers every other year with no penalty being charged.
